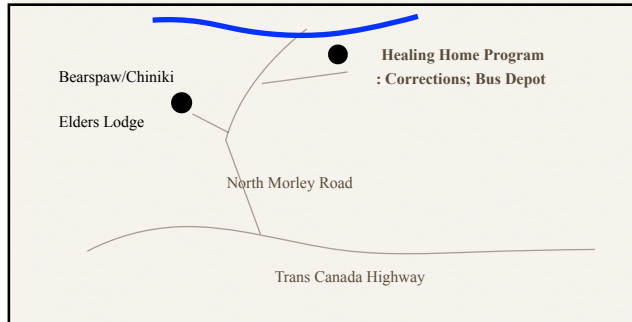


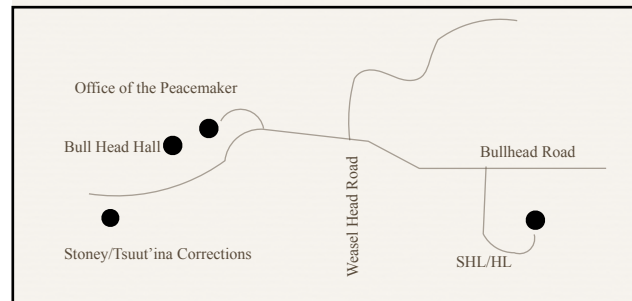

Stoney and Tsuut'ina Healing Home Treatment Program

The Healing Home Treatment Program (HHTP) is offered to the Stoney and Tsuut'ina Nations.



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An Outline of the Process for Clients

Please contact the Program Coordinator to set up a time to complete the following:

- a) Intake
- b) Individual Counselling session

Participants will be given a start date for the groups.

Each group requires a commitment of 12 to 14 weeks, attending one session per week.

Each participant is expected to attend all sessions of 2 to 3 hours depending on the most reasonable arrangements for all. Some groups may decide on two full days as an option to the full 14 weeks.

Discussion of transportation and meals will happen during the first week of group.

A certificate of completion is given at the end of the group sessions.

The participants will also be advised as to further follow-up programs that they may find beneficial to them and their families.

The primary aim of the program is for the offender of violence to take responsibility for their actions, for victims to receive help, and for children to learn about safety. Goals include a better understanding of domestic and family violence; and, how to prevent it from happening again. The ultimate goal, of course, is to reduce violence and abusive behaviour not only in the home but also in the community

Priority is given to mandated men and women residing on the Stoney and Tsuut'ina reserves. However, those from other referring agencies are welcome such as from Corrections, Child and Family and Addictions programs. We also accept self-referrals from the communities.

The program includes: awareness of personal goals; types of abuse (emotional, psychological, physical, spiritual etc.); substance abuse; anger management; intergenerational and historical trauma; jealousy, shame and guilt; healthy communications and coping skills; cultural context of values and roles; grief and loss; lateral violence and family of origin. Participants construct individualized change plans to maintain healthy intimate partner and family relationships.
